WillaKenzie Estate 2004 Pinot Gris - Willamette Valley

Soft, broad and aromatic, with lots of nectarine, grapefruit, honey and almond flavors mixing up enthusiastically as the finish persists. Drink now. H.S. **89 POINTS**

The Pinot Blanc from this property is one of the best in Oregon, though not as big and brawny as their Pinot Gris. Stone fruits and green apple flavors mix nicely in a tart but not sour wine that shows a bit of cinnamon/baking spice also. **87 POINTS**
